COD FACULTY PROFILES

Jessica Kondrath, a Chicago native, holds degrees in dance from UC Santa Barbara (BFA) and California State University, Long Beach (MFA). Her choreography through her company GRAYSCALE has been presented nationally and internationally; and she's had works commissioned by Moorpark College, Mt. San Antonio College, Cyprus College, El Camino College, Rio Hondo College, CSU Long Beach, Santa Monica College, CSU Fullerton, College of DuPage, Stevenson and Beverly Hills High Schools, and Momenta Performing Arts Company for their 35th and 40th anniversary concerts.

She has also been a guest instructor/lecturer at Loyola Marymount University, Colorado State University-Fort Collins, University of Wyoming-Laramie, CSU Fullerton, the University of Colorado-Boulder, and Novia University in Finland.

As a dancer, Kondrath recently performed the works of Carol McDowell, Liz Hoefner Adamis/Immediate Action Dance, Sarita Smith-Childs and in her own work as part of the Hi, Solo series and at Beyond Baroque's Poetry Series *You Can Get There from Here* curated by Liz Hoefner Adamis.

Kondrath has been part of an ongoing collaboration with visual artists Yumi Janairo Roth as part of her installation *Spin (After Sol LeWitt)* presented by Grand Central Arts, and Diana Baumbach showing their collaborative works nationally and internationally. She was a recipient of the Professional Artist Fellowship Grant from the Arts Council of Long Beach for her work as the Artistic Director of GRAYSCALE.

Over the past twenty years, Kondrath has also worked as a lighting designer for dance, a Pilates Instructor certified at the Kane School of Core Integration under the direction of Kelly Kane and she is currently on faculty in the Dance Departments of College of DuPage and Loyola University Chicago. Her most recent projects include an artist residency and premier of the evening length work *Invisible Landscapes* at The Visionary in Mt. Vision, NY, the 1 Hour Project with Project Bound in Chicago, and for the dance film *Hemlighet* in Vassa, Finland.

COD FACULTY PROFILES

Guillermo Leyva trained at the Professional School of Arts in Camaguey, Cuba. After graduating, he began dancing professionally at the Ballet de Camaguey under Fernando Alonso's direction. He was with the Ballet de Camaguey company for 11 years as a principal dancer where he danced several classic roles. Later he danced for three years with the Ballet de Monterrey in Mexico, under the direction of Ann Marie D' Angelo, Fernando Alonso, and Fernando Bujones. He also danced as a principal dancer with Joffrey Ballet of Chicago, Lexington Ballet, Lyric Opera of Chicago, Illinois Ballet, Cincinnati Ballet, Ballet de Santiago, Chile and Ballet Royal de Wallonie in Belgium. Leyva has worked with renowned choreographers, Alberto Alonso, Frederick Franklin and danced under the direction of Alonso King and Randy Duncan. He is co-artistic director of Alma Dance Theater, NFP.

Leyva has coached students for The Youth America Grand Prix Regionals and Finals resulting in his students placing and winning in both the junior and senior divisions. He was awarded Outstanding Teacher in 2014 at the Youth America Grand Prix Indianapolis Regional and in 2019 at the Chicago Semi-Finals.

Leyva's dream as a child was to direct his own classical ballet company and to be a successful choreographer. He also dreamed of having his own Art Ballet School to help children from low-income areas to get out of the streets and become professional dancers. One of his goals is to keep passing on to his students all of his knowledge and experience, which he has always done with deep love.

Kristina Saldarelli is a dance educator and choreographer living in the northwest suburbs of Chicago with her three children and husband. She believes dance is for everyone and strives to create an environment of fun and connection in every class.

Saldarelli holds her M.F.A. in Dance from University of Wisconsin – Milwaukee where she received The Chancellor's Graduate Student Award and Peck School of the Arts Dance Department Scholarship. Her thesis examines historical and contextual gaps upheld within tap and jazz educational and creative practices through an autoethnographic lens. In addition, she holds her M.A. in Communication, Media, and

Theatre from Northeastern Illinois University and her B.A. in Theatre Arts: Dance from University of Wisconsin - Stevens Point.

Saldarelli is currently on the dance faculty at College of DuPage as well as Movement and Sound Dance in Buffalo Grove, IL. She is an active member of the National Dance Education Organization (NDEO), Dance and Child International (daCi USA), and a frequent participant and teacher at American College Dance Festival (ACDF).

For the past 20+ years, she has provided dance education to students in a myriad of settings including universities and colleges, studios, private and public schools, and community organizations throughout the Midwest and beyond. Saldarelli served as an Adjunct Professor of Dance at Carthage College for 8 years. During that time, she taught dance courses, directed *Away from the Mirror* (2016, 2018, 2020, 2021), created several original works, and choreographed musicals. Her choreographic work has been adjudicated at ACDF, produced in professional concert venues, and ranked highly in youth dance competitions.

From 2005-2018, she danced with JUMP RHYTHM® Jazz Project, a national and international touring, Emmy-Award winning professional rhythm company. She was also a Guest Adjunct Lecturer of Jump Rhythm® Technique at Northwestern University.



STUDENT CHOREOGRAPHER PROFILES

This is **K. Spencer Fenner's** first year in COD Dance. They have previously been in College Theater productions of Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time (Information), Hare Today, Tortoise Tomorrow (Bethany Bunny), and most recently Dead Man's Cell Phone (Ensemble). Jazz and Contemporary are their favorite styles of dance, but they dance all kinds of styles and love to discover different styles and forms of dance. Fenner began dancing in high school at Downers Grove South taking part in their Orchesis Dance Company, where they began to choreograph their own pieces. Throughout their time with the Downers Grove South Orchesis, they choreographed 3 pieces that were put on stage in the Orchesis annual dance showcases in February 2020, May 2021, & April 2022. After taking a little more than a year away from dance, Fenner is so excited to be back to dancing and choreographing. They had no idea they would be dancing in this showcase, let alone choreographing a piece for it, but they happily took this opportunity with open arms after they found out that they were able to do so since they took Choreography & Composition of Dance this semester at COD. Fenner can't wait for all their friends and family to see all the hard work that they put in, and to continue dancing.

Grace Gagliano is so excited to be a part of the dance program at COD! This is her second year at COD and of dancing here! Gagliano graduated from York High School where she also participated in dance classes and performed there as well. Dance has always been Gagliano's passion. She's been taking dance classes since she was four years old. She loves to express herself within all kinds of dance, especially during her solo called, "Changes Along The Countryside." Smith Childs Dance

Sarita Smith Childs is a Chicago-based choreographer collaborating with artists to create works exploring depths of community and the issues impacting them. A native of Chicago, Smith Childs is a graduate of Sarah Lawrence College, where she received a BA degree with concentrations in Dance and Economics.

Smith Childs performed with the Joseph Holmes Chicago Dance Theatre, Momenta Dance Company, Robin Lakes Rough Dance, DanszLoop Chicago, Winifred Haun & Dancers, Cerqua Rivera Art Experience, and Thodos Dance Chicago, where she also served as the Director of Community Outreach. Smith Childs was an ensemble member, soloist, and rehearsal assistant for Randy Duncan Choreography, and was a Principal Ballet Dancer / Stunt Artist for Paramount Pictures, Save the Last Dance.

Currently, she is an Assistant Professor at Northern Illinois University. Previous teaching experience includes: Adjunct faculty of the Dance Conservatory of Barat College of DePaul University; the Lou Conte Dance Studio; and as an Instructor of Dance in the Loyola University Chicago Department of Fine and Performing Arts. Smith Childs has served as company class instructor for Giordano Dance Chicago, Joel Hall Dancers, Thodos Dance Chicago, Chicago Repertory Ballet, and is currently a company class instructor for Inaside Dance Chicago.

Prior Commissions include works for Visceral Dance Chicago, Grammy Nominated Blues harpist Billy Branch for Chicago Blues Fest; Grayscale Dance Los Angeles; Voice of the City Vaudeville Underground; Dance In the Parks and Inaside Dance Chicago.

Smith Childs received the 2022 3 Arts Chicago Award for Choreography and Teaching Arts; 2022 recipient of the South Chicago Dance Theatre Cultural Hero Award; a 2021 and 2017 nominee for the Chicago United Business Leaders of Color Award, and in 2019 was a nominee for the Armed Forces Insurance Military Spouse of the Year Award. She is a recipient of the Ruth Page Award for Dance Achievement; and is a sixtime nominee and a past winner of the Black Theater Alliance Award for Best Performance in a Music/Dance Program.

Project Bound Dance / 1 Hour Project

Under the direction of Ashley Deran and Emily Loar, Project Bound Dance is a Chicago-based modern dance group rooted in the practice of collaboration. Since its founding in 2013, Bound has created work that is both curious and accessible. Creating both live concert performance and dances for camera, Bound draws from both modern dance and somatic fundamentals. Incorporating vigor, athleticism, and intricate gesture exploration Deran and Loar weave together the vision of two distinct artistic voices to create richly textured dance performance. Bound is also home to the One Hour Project, an annual summer short film series. An experimental project emphasizing collaboration and concision, #the1hourproject gives Chicago choreographers and video artists 60 minutes to shoot the footage for a 60-second dance film in a unique Chicago location. www.projectbound.dance

Stephanie Miracle is an American born independent choreographer working in the USA and Europe. She holds a MFA in Dance 2014 from the University of Maryland and a BA in Dance from Belhaven University 2004. She became a certified teacher of Klein Technique™ in 2017 and regularly teaches workshops nationally and internationally.

A 2014/15 German Fulbright Fellow in the Performing Arts, Stephanie has focused her research on the embodied practice of tanztheater. Examples of her field work include intensively studied Jooss-Leeder technique, learned repertory from Pina Bausch with the Tanztheater Wuppertal, studied Inner Suspension with Susanne Linke, and worked on a new creation with Reinhild Hoffmann. Her research is searching for intersections between Klein Technique™ and European tanztheater specifically in dynamic use of space and expression through the body.

As a performer, she has had the privilege of dancing for Deganit Shemy, Elizabeth Dishman, Shannon Gillen & Guests, David Dorfman Dance, Joseph Poulson, Susan Marshall and Company, Liz Lerman Dance Exchange, Graham Brown, PEARSONWIDRIG DANCETHEATER, and Deborah Hay. In 2015 she joined as a full-time company member with the Folkwang Tanzstudio/FTS. She works in collaboration with Carla Jordao (PT), Idil Kemer (TU), Paola Ponti, (IT), and Anna Shchkleina (RU). Two current co-creation projects are Pity Party with Gabriel Anderson

(USA) and Dance Dialogue with Nicole Wolcott (USA) and Kristen Hollinsworth (NL).

Miracle's choreography has been described as "iconic and nuanced... with an irreverence that makes you smile unconsciously" (Rick Westerkamp review of GROOVE, 2014). Often in vivid Technicolor, Miracle's works are crafted with a cinematic sensibility. In addition to creating choreographies for traditional proscenium theaters her unique aesthetic finds special significance in common spaces for example, parking lots, bus stops, woman's prisons, hallways, staircases, and rooftops. Her projects have been presented in Germany, Mexico, Russia, New York City, and Washington DC by various institutions including MetLife Foundation, Exchange Festival, Dance Place, Supernoval Festival, Open Look Festival, Performatica, Belhaven University, ES WIRD SOGAR SCHÖN, Barnes Crossing, Fiktiva Festival, kunstOrteleven, The Clarice Smith Performing Arts Center. Other awards include the Smith Scholarship Grant to attend ImPulsTanz in 2012, dance artist-inresidence at OMI International Dance Residency 2012, Guest Mentor of Omi Dance in 2016, DC Innovation grant in 2013, Bates Dance Festival Merit Scholarship 2013, Goldhaber Travel Scholarship 2014, and NextNOW new work grant 2014. Her collaborative piece "Drafting Plan" was awarded Best Duo at Barnes Crossing Festival 2015 in Cologne and at the 2016 SzoloDuo Festival in Budapest.

She has been an artist in residence at Keshet Arts, Omi International, kunstOrt_eleven and Socrates Sculpture Park. Her dance films have been shown at Lincoln Center Dance for Camera, EnCore: Dance on Film, Reutlingen Museum, Iowa International Dance Festival, and RAD Dance Fest. She is the director of the live-cinema public performance experiment Fakers Club and was the guest choreographer for Folkwang Tanzstudio's 2018/19 season. Her full evening work wilderness tender was recently described as "sixty minutes of pure pleasure" (Ruhrzeitung 2019). In January 2020 Santa Barbara Dance Theater premiered Miracle's commissioned work 1221 Primrose Ln. She is currently a Visiting Assistant Professor at University of Iowa.

Ballet Folklorico Quetzalcoatl is led by Director and Choreographer Juan Manuel "Nery" Cruz, From San Luis Potosi, Mexico, who currently resides in Aurora, IL. According to Nery, the group was originally formed to meet a need: the need to preserve the most important aspects of the Mexican culture which is the folkloric dance. In Mexico, dance has always been an important part of the culture. Children often perform folkloric dances in schools during holidays and other special occasions. This is how Nery began his dancing career in San Luis Potosi, Mexico, where he grew up. Later he studied dance at the San Luis Potosi, *Instituto de Bellas Artes*. Every year, Nery travels to San Luis, Mex. to polish up on his skills by taking lessons to learn new steps and dances from different regions of Mexico. Throughout the year, he teaches his students these steps and dances that are usually debuted during the group's annual performance at the Paramount Arts Centre in Aurora, IL.

Ballet Folklorico Quetzalcoatl is a Mexican folk dance troupe that has been delighting audiences for over 35 years throughout IL, and as far as Mexico. The groups dream is to one day reach Europe. The group received its name "Quetzalcoatl" in 1983, the word Quetzalcoatl originates from the ancient Mexican and northern Central American Civilizations. The name "Quetzalcoatl" literally means snake or serpent with feathers of quetzal, which implies something divine or precious in the Nahuatl language. Quetzalcoatl was the god of wisdom of the primitive Mexicans, a god of the air or a sun-god and a benefactor of their race who instructed them in the use of agriculture and metals as well.


